



Orlando International Airport (MCO) South Terminal C



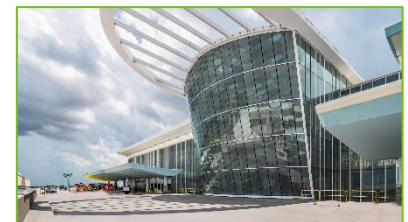
Orlando International Airport was a military airport in its beginnings and opened as a regular passenger terminal in 1984. The Avant aviation design team recently worked on the South Terminal C. This terminal consists of the south terminal complex with gates 230–245 with a pre-security tramway connecting to Terminals A & B. AVANT design the paging system throughout and meshed it with the existing system for flawless consistency throughout the entire airport. MCO is managed by the Greater Orlando Airport Authority.
